Kelvin welcomed Lewis to his first attendance of the Group and Duncan introduced himself as a Director of BASG with the lead on Access and agreed to Chair the meeting.

The meeting started with running through the objectives of the Access Group as defined within the Broads Angling Strategy. These are:

- Maintain and improve boat & bank angling opportunities
- Address and resolve conflicts of interest
- Maintain access & anglers legal rights
- Maintain and improve slipway facilities for small boats
- Maintain and improve the urban fishery
- Facilitate and provide an infrastructure for Broads angling festivals

In terms of issues to raise at the BLAF, these are the current areas of focus.

- Rollesby Broad Platforms asset transfer as a community asset
  - This is more about the complexity of land management within the Broads

This asset has taken 2 years to transfer from the BA

Beccles Fen Quay and Angling Access

This is a live issue now and demonstrates that revenue is an important element going forward

Beccles Fenland Charitable Trust was formed for this very reason, with records of angling taking place since WWII

South Walsham Slipway

Currently closed by the Parish Council

Development of existing EA bank assets (Northern Broads)

BASG will scope these venues for the next meeting

Development of revenues from the provision of Angling

Discussions on whether riparian fishing rights continue on tidal rivers, which will be highlighted at a court case being held on the 14<sup>th</sup> Aug in Great Yarmouth.
