Improved communication will encourage unified thinking with the aim of working together as a community to create opportunities to increase angling participation.</p> <p>Increased communication with other stakeholders will lead to joint delivery projects that will benefit the wider community.</p>

<p>Providing Education and Learning Opportunities</p>	<p>The company will develop education and learning platforms to encourage and support newcomers to the sport. The Broads provides a unique opportunity to introduce the wider community to the magic of angling promoting the enjoyment and conservation of the natural environment as a whole.</p> <p>Angling contributes in excess of £80m in to the local economy each year. It is therefore important that new participants are retained to ensure continued support for the businesses and jobs that rely on angling within the local community.</p>
<p>Improving the Environment</p>	<p>The Company will provide services and information to assist both the Environment Agency and The Broads Authority to ensure that the environmental needs of aquatic life are delivered within their activities.</p> <p>The company will identify and deliver projects that improve the Broad's aquatic environment, which will lead to improved environments for all aquatic species. This will benefit both the angling and wider community who enjoy the natural environment.</p>
